Submission against Digital Identity Bill 2023

I am totally against this Digital ID Bill. I do not want a Digital ID. If this legislation goes ahead, anyone who does online business (eg with the government) will end up having to get one. There won't be a choice. I like choice. I think choice is a great option – always!

I am also concerned that, yet again, there is another 'appointment' in place; so few 'elected' people.
